Tlatsini IPCA SUMMARY

Indigenous Protected and Conserved Areas (IPCAs) are identified and designated using an indigenous led process to meet First Nation priorities and interests for land protection, while supporting Canada's goal of protecting terrestrial biodiversity. The TRTFN is undertaking an initiative to identify, assess, and implement potential IPCAs that support the Tlatsini vision and complement or help implement the Taku Atlin Land Use Plan.

JOB SUMMARY:

The Technical support and community engagement liaison position will work with other members of the TIPCA team to develop potential Indigenous Protected and Conserved Areas in TRTFN Territory.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Assisting other TIPCA team members
- Engaging with TRTFN citizens (including Elders)
- Participating in engagement with other governments
- Reviewing documentation associated with IPCA development
- Onsite research and ground-truthing
- Working within the Lands Department and with Lands Manager, Charmaine Thom, to develop TRTFN priorities for IPCAs
- Assisting with workplan development
- Assisting with inter-governmental meetings, including Northern Territory file as appropriate

The specific activities of this position will be partly determined upon requirements around health and safety in light of the Covid-19 pandemic.
