No non-local hunting, fishing, or recreational activity

in Taku River Tlingit First Nation Territory

Essential Travel Only

The Taku River Tlingit First Nation is in a local State of Emergency due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

As such, TRTFN declares a restriction on non-essential travel to the TRTFN territory. This includes non-local hunting, fishing, and recreational activities.

Please contact TRTFN to understand what defines local at different times throughout the pandemic.

“Local Residents”

Currently, as of August 12, 2020, this is defined as persons that reside within a 2-hour drive of Atlin.

Please note, that this 2-hour driving ‘bubble’ will become smaller if cases of Covid start to rise within the area.

First Nations Communities

First Nations have jurisdiction in states of emergency to protect the health and safety of their communities.

- Some First Nations under their local states of emergency have issued travel restrictions related to travel into their communities
- Essential travellers are asked to respect check-points and comply with restrictions unless providing services at the request of the First Nation community
- Prior to leaving for your hunting or fishing trip, review individual First Nation websites to check if they are welcoming visitors
